Our History

HOPDEV is Women-led, and self-led grassroots organization for women and girls from diverse background, including women living with disabilities, HIV/Aids and with no income. It founded in 2014 with the group of based-volunteers Women and girls, survivors of various civil wars in the Republic democratic of Congo, Burundi, Rwanda, Somalia and Ethiopian in which experienced difference forms of Gender-based-violence (GBV), Sexual reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), exploitation, abuse and assault in their families and the entire communities.

The HOPDEV organization hereby constituted is a non-profit and local Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) called : **<< Hope of women against poverty for the social wellbeing>>** its shorten name is; HOPDEV. The organization is not free from political. It may be transferred to another Place In the territory, country or elsewhere in the world by the decision of the General Assembly (GA) on the proposal of the Executive Board or two (2/3) of the members of the organization.

Also created as the solution of challenges in which women and girls' are facing in their locations and surrounding(s). In addition, where we commenced a positive cycle in which women and girls are not considered as simple recipients of services and support, but as actors of changes for themselves, families and the host communities.

HOPDEV is therefore committed to improve, empower, and to help the most disadvantaged women and girls to claim their rights, challenge discrimination and overcome poverty.

-We are promoting Women's economic empowerment for Marginalized and vulnerable women and girls including income generation activities and financial, and decision making in the household through vocational and business trainings, savings as well as credit and/ or loans



THE SKILLS TO BOOST SELF-ENGAGEMENT



At HOPDEV, we have established avocational training center in Dzaleka camp to provide and promote in different vocational skills including tailoring, business, Agriculture and life skills classes, so participants are able to access the labor market to begin engaging in trade. Through COHERE's support, 60 single mothers have increased their cash incomes to meet the need soft their dependents.




